# St Patrick's Primary School School Uniform Policy

In choosing to send your child to St Patrick's, you are agreeing to follow the Policies of the school. Please find below our current School Uniform Policy.

#### **Footwear**

- BOYS: Black shoes. No footwear to have any coloured trims, laces or logos.
- GIRLS: Black shoes. Heels unacceptable.
- Boots can be worn travelling to school but children will need to change into shoes on arrival at school.

## Socks

- BOYS: Grey
- GIRLS: Grey/White no trims. Summer Green gingham trim if preferred to match dresses.
- Socks should be ankle or knee length. No trainer socks.

## **Tights**

• Grey, white or green

## **Skirts/Trousers/Dresses**

- GIRLS: Skirts or Pinafore dresses acceptable. Skirts and full length trousers must be grey not black or charcoal. In summer girls should wear a dress or skirt – not shorts, culottes or cut off trousers.
- BOYS: Short trousers are only acceptable in summer.

## **Blouses/Shirts**

White polo shirt with no coloured trims.

## **Sweatshirts/Cardigans/Jumpers**

- School sweatshirts can be bought and ordered through the school.
- Dark green cardigans and jumpers may be worn as previously as an alternative.

## PE Kit

- All children are expected to take part in PE and should wear a yellow polo top with green shorts. Kit with school logo and school shirts can be purchased from the school
- Pumps or trainers to be worn for PE, no shoes.

#### **Hairstyles**

- SHOULD BE SUITABLE FOR SCHOOL
- Governors expect appropriate hairstyles e.g no dyeing, no tram lines, no shaved designs, no excessive coloured beads.
- Accessories must be limited to school colours green, grey, white and black.
- Girls with long hair must have it tied back.

# <u>Jewellery</u>

Only watches and stud earrings may be worn which must be taped for PE.

#### Nail Varnish/Make-Up

No nail varnish, false nails or make-up should be worn to school.

# **CONSEQUENCES OF NON-COMPLIANCE**

The Governors have requested that the Headteacher and Staff at the school, monitor compliance with this policy on a daily basis.

- Parents of any children appearing at school with the wrong uniform on will be contacted with a request made to put it right.
- If there is any reason, at any time, that your child is not in correct uniform, it is the responsibility of parents to <u>inform the Headteacher</u>.
- The Headteacher will contact parents if no explanation is available.
- This initial discussion will be followed by a written formal warning.
- If all attempts to attend to incorrect uniform have been ignored, the child will be excluded.
- Obviously this is not an option that the Governors would like to choose so we ask for your support in ensuring this does not occur.
